Video Production Pathway

Video Production 1A/B

This course provides a basic understanding of all the aspects of the film and television industry as well as learning how to produce videos. Students will be trained in the use of cameras, editing equipment, script writing, story boarding, and how to do voice-overs. Students will learn the basic steps involved in producing their own videos as they use the equipment to produce commercials, public service announcement, movies, and music videos. In Video Production 1B students will learn the more advanced techniques of video production in preparation for a career placement. Students will be instructed in the use of HD cameras, green-screen effects, and lighting. Students will work with small groups to enhance their skills in producing larger scale videos. Part of this class will be dedicated to making small feature films to enter into the Santa Clarita Festival.

Career Exploration Project

This one-semester course is required for all senior students

Seniors have a unique opportunity to demonstrate and apply twelve years of education; they become explorers, creators, risk takers, decision makers, independent learners, and leaders. All components of this project are linked to a topic of personal interest, which furthers a student's opportunity to explore career opportunities. The project will demonstrate a learning stretch on the part of the student. The project requires a minimum of 45 hours from the student in which they job shadow, volunteer in the community or learn a new skill. The student will identify and collaborate with a community mentor in the development of their project, which will help enable the students to make an informed future career choice.
